In May of 2007, Palm Coast Christian School, where I had worked for 5 years, closed. My mother was gone 2 months later. I felt adrift. I knew God had plans for me but wasn't sure where or what.

I applied to work at Samaritan Ministries. I started when we had "the house" and worked 3-4 hours a week while the "house mother" took classes. I never dreamed that I would be staying 3 nights a week as a night time "house mother" for nearly a year. Lorraine is *very* persuasive! Philippians 4:13 says, "I can do all things through Christ who gives me strength."

I had the joy of sharing evening meals with the ladies and children who were residents. For every bit of encouragement I tried to give, I received encouragement and blessings back TEN-FOLD! It was my privilege to give a mom and her baby a ride home from the hospital in Orlando; and to offer words of encouragement a few months later as they waited for transport from the hospital in Flagler to the hospital in Orlando.

I've given rides to shop for groceries, doctor visits and to look for rooms to rent. There is much to be done. (Lorraine, you are awesome!) God has put this ministry on Lorraine's heart....There is a great need for this ministry. We need a house that can accommodate at least 6 women!
