and specifically, our mission. It touches hearts and opens eyes about what it truly means to "love thy neighbor". As we all may have many questions for God, this is one time where we can see how He directly answers a question about eternal life and an even more specific question about how we are called to treat others.

In this passage, Jesus is being tested by an expert in the law and is asked what he must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus then replies with another question, "What is written in the law?" The man recites the law and asks for clarity, "And who is my neighbor?" Trying to explain this concept, Jesus begins to tell the parable of the Good Samaritan. There is an injured man beaten by robbers on the side of the street half dead. A priest and a Levite happen to be going in the same direction and as they pass by him they don't



pay any attention to the man and walk by on the opposite side of the road.

Then comes along a Samaritan who is a stranger to this man. He goes to him, tends to his wounds, and wraps him with bandages. He puts him on his own donkey and walks beside him as he leads him to an inn and pays for him to be taken care of for a month.

We named our ministry after this story because we feel that it embodies who we are as a group and what we strive to do.
