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The Guilded Cage

What do you see when you hear "human trafficking"? Children being snatched up in third world countries or even here in the USA where homeless children are desperate for a home, or maybe unaware parents taking their eyes off their children for just a moment while shopping? That can and does happen, however there is another way that is taking place right before our very eyes.

This story is about an eighteen-year-old-young lady who was brought up in a Christian home with lots of love and boundaries. She worked in a restaurant in her home town. She normally heeded the "rules" of the home and was fine with them. Waitressing opens doors to meeting people and many become regulars. There was an older man who would come in often and strike up a conversation with the young woman, and, over a period of time, the two learned much about one another. Unbeknownst to the young woman, he was passing the information on to two very handsome young men who were a little older than she.

When they started coming in to the restaurant, they knew what she looked like, her interests, and personal history. She could not believe how much they had in common with her in just a few short conversations. She delighted in talking to them and befriended them. They told her all about the mansion they lived in and their glamorized lifestyle enticed her further. One day they invited her to spend the weekend with them. They would have a weekend of doing the things that she really enjoyed doing. She was hooked. She called her mom from work and asked if she could spend the night with a girl friend. The mom said no. The young lady told the two men that she could not go. They reminded her that she was eighteen and could make her own choices. She went with them.

Everything they had told her about their mansion and other points of interest that sounded too good to be true was right before her eyes. A phone call came in to the men. Could they come to Arizona soon? The men knew this was a desire of her heart from the earlier conversations with the older man. When asked if she would like to go to Arizona with them, she jumped at the offer. The plan was in motion. However, there was a friend of the family who knew about this kind of human trafficking and enlightened the parents. Plan B went into action.

The friend of the family arranged to have a female authority meet with the young woman at a motel. The parents and the friend of the family assured her it would be alright to meet with the woman and explained to her what these men were up to. She met with the authority and was taken back to her home. Had she gone with the two men, she would have been sold at a high price to someone in another country to be locked into sex slavery for the rest of her life.

These people are seeking young, beautiful, and gullible girls. This young woman in her interview emphasized a very important point for parents. When your child asks about something, take the time to explain why it is harmful. "No, because I said so" does not cut it with children. They want to know *why* they can't do a particular thing and will find out on their own the reason why they can't, which could lead them into a fate worse than death. Communicate with your children even when it's not a convenient time. It could save their life.
