My life was not nearly as disrupted as it could have been...

As I look back, I realize the tough decisions my mom, Cayti Recker, had to make as a single parent. My father left us when I was just two years old. As a young child, I did not recognize that it was Samaritan Ministries helping to keep our lives on an even keel. Not only did we receive financial assistance, groceries, clothing and furniture, but also unconditional love and encouragement from the Samaritan Ministries team. They were there with emotional support through long days of adjusting to life without dad in the home. I slept in an air conditioned home, we

had a kitchen table for meals together, and I still knew the Christmas morning traditions that my older sisters knew from when we were a two-parent family! As a stay-at-home mom, she was able to continue homeschooling us. They even helped my mom go back to college to get her degree in interpretation

for the deaf.

When we became part of the Samaritan "family", they became a part of ours! I honestly don't know where we would be today, if it wasn't for Samaritan Ministries.

Today we volunteer to give back to this ministry that helps other women through crisis situations. Like a light in the darkness, we walk beside them through their hardships so they know they're not alone.
