Heather's Testimony

"The Samaritan Inn was an instrument of divine timing at a most crucial point in my life. In April 2006, I was in the process of packing up my six year-old son and myself to enter into the unchartered world of single parenthood. Clueless about where to start, I called Lorraine, who I knew from Alpha Pregnancy Center, and was confident she could give direction to women (with or without children) first getting out of abusive relationships. I was not aware of Samaritan Ministries yet or a transition home that had opened up only a few short months before. Ironically, that's where Lorraine asked me to meet her and that was the beginning of a long journey.

The Bible speaks of a time for laughter, a time for tears; and there's been plenty of both from where I started off ten years ago straight up until now. As seasons in our lives change, so are the reasons we laugh and cry. Emotions were hard to reconcile in the beginning when I had the realities of

divorce and being a single mom for an indefinite period of time staring me in the face. I could only process what I had in front of me on a day-to-day basis.

As in any home, structure along with compromise and compliance were expected. But in exchange there was free access to resources that enabled us with life skills once we moved on. Constant provision through donations and prayer nourished us physically and spiritually. Continued supporters of Samaritan Ministries are appreciated as new ones are encouraged.

As the line for women and children in need gets longer, the amount of time it takes for the new Samaritan Inn to open its doors gets shorter. Those who enter with honest intention for change in their lives and in themselves will be given opportunity to transform both from the inside out.

My experience of being a house mom at the Samaritan Ministries transition home in the past was a learning experience and a blessing. One of my passions is to help people, so becoming a house mom was right up my alley. It was not the cake walk I thought it would be; however, there were many wonderful moments. Meeting new ladies and children going through tremendous hardship was tough on the heart strings, especially when we had to turn them away due to no vacancy. For those who were able to take advantage of our program, the Samaritan Ministries team came together to help change the direction of their lives. With the help of our LORD, they moved on in the right direction. We enjoyed watching the transformation of the women as they became functioning people who could earn a living and provide for their children. While there were many success stories, there were times when we had to let some go, which was always difficult. There have to be rules, and they have to be followed in order to keep things running smoothly. This county desperately needs a transition home, and we're getting closer to getting one, thanks to everyone taking an active part. God bless you all richly.
